ESPN Coverage

ESPN and ESPN Deportes team up for an unprecedented Olympic-style production to deliver complete multiplatform coverage of the 2015 Pan American Games from Toronto, starting Friday, July 10 at 7:30 p.m. ET with the Opening Ceremony live on ESPN and ESPN Deportes.

ESPN and ESPN2 will present 66 live coverage hours. Between July 11-25, ESPN2 will present two to six hours of daily live coverage, including swimming. The network will also present daily highlights of all medal winners and the action across every venue.

Every Pan American coverage option on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN3, Longhorn Network, ESPN Deportes and ESPN Deportes+ will also be available through WatchESPN, accessible on computers, smartphones, tablets and additional devices.

About the Pan American Games:

The Pan American Games are the world's third-largest international multisport Games; they are only surpassed in size and scope by the Olympic Summer Games and the Asian Games. The first Pan American Games were held in Buenos Aires, Argentina, in 1951 and the inaugural Parapan American Games were held in Mexico City in 1999. Both the Pan Am and Parapan Am Games are held every four years for the athletes of the 41 PASO member nations, in the year preceding the Olympic and Paralympic Summer Games.

Team USA Looks to Remain Atop Pan Am Medal Count

At the 2011 Pan American Games in Guadalajara, Mexico, Team USA topped the swimming medal count with 44 medals in the pool - 20 more than runner-up Brazil - and also won 18 of the 32 gold medals awarded. Five members of that team return in Toronto.

Legendary Coughlin to Make Pan Am Debut

Twelve-time Olympic medalist **Natalie Coughlin** has just about done it all in her swimming career, but she will make her Pan American Games debut in Toronto, where she is slated to swim the 50m and 100m free. She enters the meet seeded No. 2 in the 100m free and sixth in the 50m free. Coughlin is a three-time Olympian (2004, 2008 and 2012) and is gearing up for a run at a fourth Games roster next summer. With 12 career Olympic medals, she is tied with **Dara Torres** and **Jenny Thompson** for the most by an American female swimmer.

Decorated U.S. Roster Headed to Toronto

The Team USA roster headed to Toronto includes eight Olympians, who have qualified for a combined 15 Olympic teams over the course of their decorated careers. Coughlin and **Darian Townsend**, formerly of South Africa, are three-time Olympians, while **Cullen Jones**, **Allison Schmitt** and **Amanda Weir** are two-timers. Five of the Olympians are gold medalists, with Coughlin and Schmitt claiming individual gold medals.

A Springboard to Rio?

Time will tell if the 2015 Pan American Games will serve as a springboard to success next summer, but a quartet of swimmers made the most of their 2011 Pan Am Games experience and went on to earn a spot on the U.S. roster for the 2012 Olympic Games - Rachel Bootsma, Claire Donahue, Conor Dwyer and Charlie Houchin. All four walked away from London as Olympic relay medalists for Team USA.

Mr. & Mrs. Team USA

USA Swimming National Team members **Emily Brunemann** and **Michael Klueh** were married in September 2014 and will spend this summer representing Team USA at the Pan American Games and FINA World Championships. In Toronto, Klueh will swim the 200m and 400m free, while Brunemann tackles the 10-kilometer open water race. At the Kazan, Russia, FINA World Championships, Klueh made the roster in the 800m free relay, and Brunemann will swim the 25K open water event.

Worrell is One to Watch

Kelsi Worrell enters the Pan American Games coming off a stellar collegiate season for the University of Louisville where she swept the 100y and 200y butterfly events at the 2015 NCAA Championships and set American and U.S. Open records in the 100y fly in the process. She'll look to carry that success over to long-course competion in her international debut for Team USA in Toronto.

Cullen Jones Makes a Splash

After nearly drowning at age 5, Olympic medalist **Cullen Jones**, who will swim the 50m and 100m free in Toronto, is passionate about spreading the world about the importance of swim lessons and water safety. Jones is an ambassador for the USA Swimming Foundation, which seeks to raise national awareness about the importance of learning to swim through its Make a Splash initiative. Earlier this year, Jones made appearances in Freeport, Texas, Chicago and San Antonio,

Texas, to help spread this message as a part of the USA Swimming Foundation's Make a Splash Tour Presented by Phillips 66.
