CALL TO ORDER

The Saturday, September 28, 2024, USA Swimming House of Delegates (HOD) meeting was opened by hosts Zach Toothman, Zone Directors' Council Co-Chair, and Ryan Gibbons, member of the HOD Working Group and National Board of Review, at 12:49 p.m. Mountain Daylight Time.

USA SWIMMING BOARD CHAIR'S WELCOME

Chris Brearton, Chair of the Board of Directors, welcomed the members of the HOD and remarked on the importance and passion of the volunteers within USA Swimming. Mr. Brearton discussed the future as the organization moves towards LA2028, by supporting the grassroots of the sport.

RULES AND REGULATIONS CHAIR ELECTION

Derek Paul, Associate General Counsel and Rules & Regulations Committee Chair, opened the vote to elect Taylor Rogers to fulfill the remainder of his term as Rules & Regulations Committee Chair.

MOTION: That the House of Delegates vote to approve Taylor Rogers as Chair of the Rules and Regulations Committee as appointed by the Board Chair for the remainder of Derek Paul's 2-year term concluding in September 2025. Motion passed.

OPENING REMARKS

Shana Ferguson, Interim Chief Executive Officer and Chief Operating Officer, expressed her gratitude for the work done over the past week, highlighting the feedback she has heard, the interactions she has seen, and what she has learned about USA Swimming through the point of view of the members.

BOARD ELECTION

Mr. Paul opened the election for the Independent seat on the Board of Directors.

FOUNDATION REPORT

Elizabeth Beisel, USA Swimming Foundation Board of Directors member, discussed the three pillars of the Foundation's mission: Saving Lives, Building Champions, and Impacting Communities.

Mr. Gibbons asked for a moment of silence in remembrance of USA Swimming members who have passed away this past year.

PRESENTATIONS TO PAST BOARD MEMBERS

Mr. Gibbons thanked former USA Swimming Board of Directors member Bill Schalz, who served on the Board of Directors from 2019 – 2023, for his invaluable support.

CREDENTIALS REPORT

Laurie Benton, Credentials & Elections Committee Chair, reported that 336 delegates out of 367 were credentialed.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Eric Skufca, Chief Financial Officer, reported that the organization is in a strong financial position with a healthy balance sheet. Mr. Skufca noted that the organization's assets far outweigh its liabilities, yielding a material net asset balance which has given the organization stable footing in not only executing its annual operating budgets but also in investing in non-operating Board-approved reserve initiatives such as Keeping Athletes First 1.0 and 2.0. Additionally, Mr. Skufca added that another component of financial stability is having ample cash balances and excess operating reserves, of which both are held at balances greater than the organization's policy requirements.

Mr. Skufca remarked on the year-over-year growth during the current quad of our three key revenue streams: membership, sponsorship, and our partnership with the United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee. All three have seen year-over-year growth throughout the 2022-2024 quad. Mr. Skufca also noted the fourth key revenue driver in 2024, the U.S. Olympic Team Trials – Swimming, which profited over \$5 million for USA Swimming. The organization is currently projecting breakeven operating results for the 2022-2024 quad. Lastly, Mr. Skufca showed the page

on the USA Swimming website where access to USA Swimming financial documents and resources can be found.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

Angela Monty, Registration & Membership Committee Chair, presented the Membership Report, including a comparison of the 2023 and 2024 membership statistics (Attachment 3).

HOD WORKING GROUP PRESENTATION

Mary Plant, HOD Working Group Chair, shared the composition of the HOD Working Group and the work done by the group. Mrs. Plant presented the legislation to update the composition of the HOD.

USA SWIMMING BOARD ELECTION RESULTS

Mr. Paul announced that the 10-Year Athletes have elected Nic Fink and Allison Schmitt to the Athletes' Advisory Council. He also noted that there will be a runoff between Ryan Murphy and Carson Foster for the third open seat, due to a tie.

Mr. Paul announced that the HOD elected Kathy Fish to the Independent seat on the Board of Directors and that the 10-Year Athletes have elected Nic Fink to the 10-Year Athlete seat on the Board of Directors.

RULES & REGULATIONS

USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee Chair, Taylor Rogers, presented the 2024 Proposed Amendments to the Rulebook. Additionally, Ms. Rogers provided the procedures for pulling legislation, making a motion, speaking on legislation, and voting.

The HOD voted to adopt legislative proposals R-1 through R-14 along with HK-1 through HK-16 and the Resolution to Increase the Annual Club Fee (Attachment 4).

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Toothman adjourned the meeting at 3:17 p.m. Mountain Time.

ARTICLE 6 HOUSE OF DELEGATES

- 6.1 MEMBERS the following shall be the voting members of the House of Delegates:
 - .1 All voting members of the Board of Directors, other than the 10-Year Athlete Representatives to the Board, who receive votes pursuant to Bylaw 6.1.13;
 - .2 All Coach Directors, Non-Coach Directors, Athlete Directors, and the Junior Athlete Representatives from the Zone Directors' Council:
 - .3 Four (4) LSC Athlete Representatives (as defined in the then current Required LSC Bylaws) from each Zone selected by the Athlete Director and the Junior Athlete Representative from each Zone;
 - .4 Three (3) non-coach, non-athlete members from each Zone selected by each respective Zone's Coach and Non-Coach Directors;
 - .5 Seven (7) members of the Rules & Regulations Committee to include the Committee Chair, one (1) 2-Year Athlete member, and five (5) non-athlete members selected by the voting members of the Committee;
 - .6 All coach members of the National Team Steering Committee, other than the Chair of the National Team Steering Committee (who is a voting member pursuant to 6.1.1, if a coach member, or pursuant to 6.1.13, if a 10-Year Athlete Representative);
 - .7 Ten (10) members of the Age Group Development Committee to include at least five (5) coach members, three (3) non-athlete members, and two (2) 2-Year Athlete members selected by the voting members of the Committee;
 - .8 Ten (10) members of the Senior Development Committee to include at least five (5) coach members, three (3) non-athlete members, and two (2) 2-Year Athlete members selected by the voting members of the Committee;
 - .9 Seven (7) non-athlete coach members of the Coach Advisory Council selected by the voting members of the Council;
 - .10 The eleven (11) 2-Year Athlete members of the Athletes' Executive Committee, as well as two (2) additional 2-Year Athletes designated by the AEC by majority vote.
 - .11 One (1) non-coach, non-athlete member from each LSC as selected by each respective LSC's Board of Directors;
 - .12 Three (3) non-athlete coach members from each LSC as selected by each respective LSC's Board of Directors, except that the five (5) LSCs with the smallest number of registered athletes shall select two (2) non-athlete coach members and the five (5) LSCs with the largest number of registered athletes shall select four (4) non-athlete coach members. The size of the LSCs shall be determined by the number of registered athletes as of August 31 of the prior calendar year;

- .13 A sufficient number of 10-Year Athletes and 10-Year+ Athletes whose voting power shall constitute one-third (33.3%) of the total House of Delegates and shall include the voting members of the AAC, the 10-Year Athlete members of the AEC, and the 10-Year Athlete members of the Board of Directors. This may be achieved by actual votes or by weighted voting. A minimum of twenty percent (20%) must be 10-Year Athlete representatives and the remainder may be 10-Year+ Athlete representatives; any weighted voting must preserve these proportions. At least half (50%) of these athlete members of the House of Delegates must have obtained 10-Year Athlete or 10-Year+ Athlete representative eligibility through competing at an event that, at the time of election/selection, is on a USOPC Delegation Event program.
- .14 10-Year Athlete representatives and 10-Year+ Athlete representatives shall be directly elected by athletes who meet the same eligibility standards as 10-Year Athletes. However, by majority vote, the AAC may replace the following delegates under Bylaw 6.1.13 with designees if a delegate informs the AAC that they are unavailable for the Annual Meeting of the House of Delegates: voting members of the AAC, the 10-Year Athlete members of the Board of Directors. Any designee appointed by the AAC pursuant to this provision must be a 10-Year Athlete.
- .15 To the extent that any of the individuals selected by the voting members of the Committees under Bylaws 6.1.5 through 6.1.9, are afforded votes under other provisions of Article 6, the respective committee (by majority vote) shall select a designee from the same membership governance category as the individual (e.g., a 2-Year Athlete committee member's vote will be designated to another 2-Year Athlete), to assume that individual's committee vote. For purposes of this Bylaw 6.1.15, the membership governance categories are coach, 10-Year Athlete, 10-Year+ Athlete, 2-Year Athlete, non-athlete, and non-coach non-athlete.
- All members of the House of Delegates shall serve until their successors are selected, except that membership may be terminated by resignation filed with the Secretary & General Counsel or their designee. All members under 6.1 must be elected on or before July 1 of each year and written certification thereof must be sent to the Secretary & General Counsel or their designee on or before July 15. No substitution of a member may be made unless written certification thereof is given to the Secretary & General Counsel or their designee at least 72 hours before the House of Delegates is called to order.
- .17 Membership on any committee notwithstanding, USA Swimming employees shall not be members of the House of Delegates.

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the USA Swimming House of Delegates approves the annual club fee for year-round clubs to be \$225 and the annual fee for the first year for all new clubs to be \$750.
